Title I Reports MDE Reports:

Fred Williams

- The Office of Field Services (OFS) is planning a soft rollout of the ESSA.
- NCLB regulations are still in effect.
- Title I, Part A and Title II, Part A preliminary allocations are posted on the MDE website.
- MDE is in the process of revising the Study Guide with the intention that ESSA is going into effect.
- Schoolwide Flexibility information is posted under "current topics" on the OFS website.
- MDE is continuously working on the comprehensive needs assessment.
- School-wide Flexibility isn't new. It involves completing three templates in MEGS+ Title I School Selection. Template#1 includes guiding questions; template#2 requires examples of supplemental services; template #3 includes intent and purpose (short narrative describing how supplement services will be provided to low achieving
- New codes in MEGS+ are to be used only if the District is using Schoolwide Flexibility.
- Schoolwide Flexibility is utilizing all Title I, Part A funds.
- Class-size Reduction is basically finished.
- Funding for Foster care students have been taken from McKinney-Vento and put into Title I. Under ESSA, foster care will be a new subgroup.
- There is a committee working on writing the State plan for ESSA.
- Highly Qualified (HQ) is taken out of ESSA, effective immediately. MDE has to develop qualifications for HQ teachers.

OEII Updates:

- The MDE Surveys of Enacted Curriculum (SEC) conference will be held June 1, 2016.
 Next Generation Science Standards have been coded into the SEC.

Legislative Update:

Wendy Larvick

House Bill 5160 mandates that high schools provide instruction in CPR and defibrillation as part of the curriculum.

Senate:

- SB 4493: mandates genocide education as part of the curriculum in Michigan schools
- SB 4822: Third grade reading proposal prohibiting schools from promoting students to grade 4 if they are performing at least a full grade level behind in reading.
- SB 826: "Scrap" common core curriculum in Michigan schools and replace it with the curriculum that was used in Massachusetts in 2008-09 school year.
